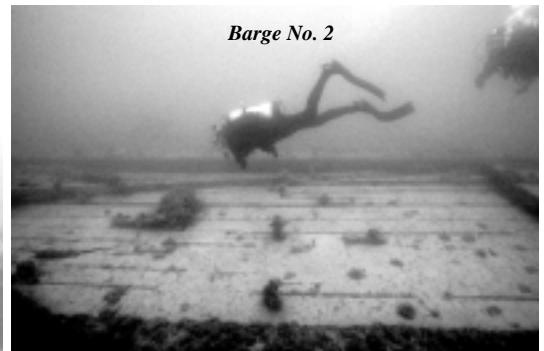
UASC Plans Shipwreck DVD!

Presently in the planning stage is a commercial DVD about Chicago area shipwrecks to be produced by the Underwater Archaeological Society of Chicago in time for the 2009 "Our World -- Underwater" Show on February 20-22. **Ruth Loftus** is coordinating the various segments which will comprise this new DVD. **Bob Gadbois** will handle technical production. The main shipwrecks which will be included at this point in time are the tug *Tacoma* (by **John Loftus**), *The Straits of Mackinac* (by **Chet Childs**), the *St. Marys* (by **Keith Pearson**), the *Wells Burt* (by **Cris Kohl**), the *Material Service* (by **Jim Jarecki**), the Zion Subchaser (by **Tony Kiefer**), and others, including perhaps the *Rotarian*, the *Wings of the Wind*, the *Illinois/Holly* barge, and the wrecks pictured above. Above, l. to r.: **Joan Forsberg** videotapes some of the badly broken-up remains of the very historic *David Dows*, the largest sailing ship ever built on the Great Lakes (this 265-foot-long vessel had FIVE masts!) and lost in a storm in 1889; Joan examines the four-bladed propeller of the wooden steamer, *Louisville*, burned and sunk in 1857 with one life lost; divers explore the large, wooden remains, nearly flattened by time and nature, of *Barge No. 2*, a railroad car ferry sunk in 1906. Buccaneer Nearly Cleaned Up



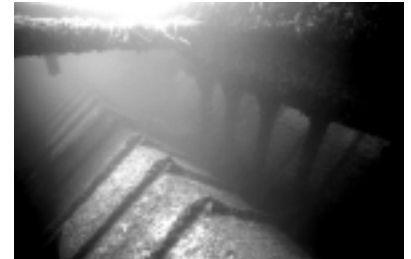

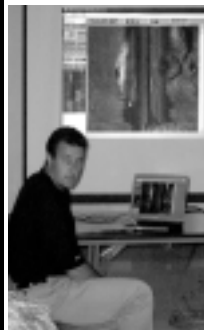
