UASC Survey Work on *Rotarian* Shipwreck Leaps Forward!

With nearly everything ready to complete the formal UASC "Report on the Wreck of the *Material Service*," we have decided to try to finish work on the wreck of the *Rotarian* (left), which lies in 80 feet of water eight miles off Chicago. Launched in 1889 at Sandusky, Ohio, as the *A. Wehrle, Jr.*, and renamed *Rotarian* in 1919, the 147-foot-long wooden paddlewheel steamer ended her colorful years docked in the Chicago River, serving as, among other things, a speakeasy. Old age caused her to sink at the dock, so she was raised and scuttled in Lake Michigan in 1931. UASC Dive Coordinator **Michael Angelo Gagliardi** had a natural reaction (below, left) when heavily armed Coast Guard boats accompanied us out of the harbor because President Obama was flying to Chicago that day -- and we could not re-enter the harbor until five hours later! 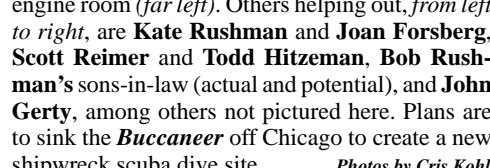

Explore Chicago Shipwrecks DVD!

A brand new DVD about Chicago shipwrecks, produced by the Underwater Archaeological Society of Chicago, is available!

The 7 shipwrecks detailed in this DVD are the schooner *St. Mary* (lost in Sept., 1860), the *Wings of the Wind* (an 1866 collision victim), the large schooner *Wells Burt* (lost with all hands in May, 1883), the tug *Tacoma* (founded in 1929), the speakeasy ship *Rotarian* (scuttled in 1931), the barge *Material Service* (sunk with 15 lives lost in 1936), and *The Straits of Mackinac*, a 1929 ferry purposely sunk in 2003.

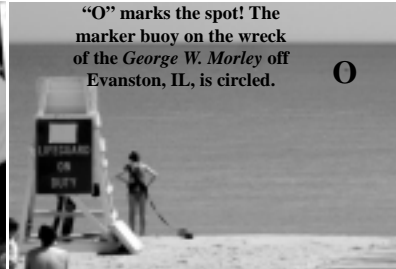

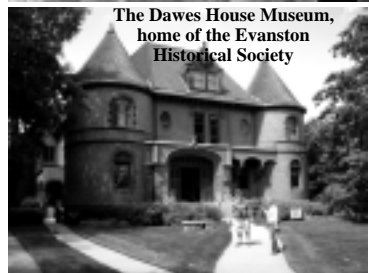

Affordable Sidescan from Humminbird

In the 1980's and 1990's, a sidescan sonar unit could cost anywhere from \$15,000 to \$80,000, sums of money that only fanatical shipwreck hunters with deep pockets were willing and able to spend. As with all electronics, the price has come down -- dramatically! The long-established fishing electronics company named Humminbird offers three models priced at \$1,200, \$2,200, and \$3,000. At left, the image of the badly broken up *Rotarian* was made using the high end model, but equally good images are produced by the less expensive ones. This is something the UASC should investigate and consider.

UASC is working on a photo mosaic of this shipwreck, plus videotaping every part of this wreck.

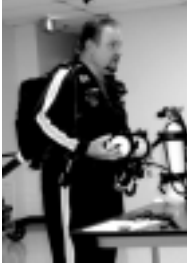

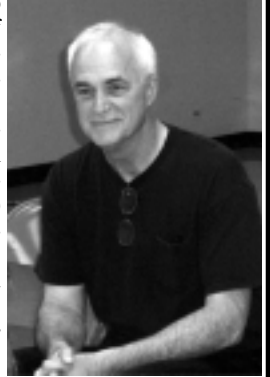
Don Doherty At Our April, 2009 Meeting

The UASC conducts shipwreck site surveys which employ field drawings, underwater photography and videotape. Field survey work is augmented by academic historical research. The Society attempts

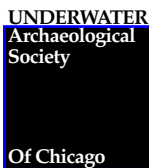
to preserve sites by studying the effects of natural and biological forces as well as the impact of human activity on shipwrecks. It advocates responsible use of submerged cultural resources.
